

### HRMA ANNUAL REPORT 2017-2018

HRMA Executive Committee in 2017 formed multiple subcommittees and had various detailed discussions to start Website, Malayalam Classes and to conduct fundraising.

- ❖ HRMA's Logo & Website: Logo and Website was outsourced to a company called Hardsoft in Kerala, India and the lead for the effort was Xavier Konathapally. Executive Committee wanted a logo that featured Kerala as well as Hampton Roads. All CM's gave their inputs and we were able to create a unique logo for the association. To take the website idea forward, HRMA formed a subcommittee with Xavier Konathapally, Rejith Raveendran, Snitha Krishnan, Joby Varghese and Ceril Chummar. \$499 was paid for creating the both logo and website for HRMA. Website was completed as of 16 March, 2018 and it will be maintained and updated by Rejith Raveendran.
- ❖ HRMA Malayalam Classes: HRMA formed a Malayalam Classes Subcommittee with Nisaraj Dharmarajan, Rejith Raveendran, Snitha Krishnan and Jikku Abraham. They were able to come up with a structured curriculum and sufficient materials for the classes with the help of 6 volunteers. Volunteers for Malayalam Classes were Linda, Neena, Lekshmi, Bini, Arathy and Anjaly. Malayalam Classes started in OCT 2017 and it consist of curriculum based on teaching youth the basics of the language. Malayalam classes will be held once a month at Bayside Presbyterian Church at Virginia Beach. Our goal is to provide language tools for the children and help them develop their own sense of understanding of the language. The cost associated with holding classes will be solely covered by donations. HRMA was able to raise \$235 in donations from various members of our community.
- ❖ HRMA Fundraising/Advertising: HRMA formed a fundraising/advertising Committee to include Nisaraj Dharmarajan, Iype Philip, and Jikku Abraham. HRMA had a handful of sponsors in the year 2017.
